Family Caregiver Leave Bill Passes Second Reading, Referred to Committee

On September 6, 2012, <u>Bill 30, Family Caregiver Leave Act (Employment Standards Amendment)</u>, <u>2011</u> carried at Second Reading and was <u>referred to the Standing Committee on Social Policy</u>.

As previously reported, Bill 30 would, if passed, amend the *Employment Standards Act, 2000* to create Family Caregiver Leave. The leave would be available to all full-time, part-time, permanent, or contract employees covered by the *Employment Standards Act, 2000* in certain circumstances to provide care for relatives and family members.

Bill 30 would build on the existing <u>Family Medical Leave</u>, which currently provides up to eight weeks of job-protected leave to provide care or support to certain individuals if the individual has a serious medical condition with a significant risk of death occurring within a period of 26 weeks.
