Ontario Announces Stage 3 Reopening for Certain Regions

Date: July 13, 2020

Today, the Ontario government announced that 24 regions in Ontario are moving to the <u>Stage 3 of the provincial re-opening plans</u> effective Friday, July 17, 2020. The Orders made under the *Emergency Management and Civil Protection Act* giving effect to this announcement have not yet been published and we will provide further updates on the Stage 3 reopening as may be necessary. In order that you may continue your Return to Work planning, however, here is what we know as of today.

Subject to physical distancing (two metres), the Stage 3 reopening will permit:

- indoor gatherings to a maximum of 50 people
- outdoor gatherings to a maximum of 100 people.

As stated in the news release, these limits apply "to indoor and outdoor events, such as community events or gatherings, concerts, live shows, festivals, conferences, sports and recreational fitness activities, fundraisers, fairs, festivals or open houses."

Many activities are not yet permitted to open as they are considered high-risk. These include amusement and water parks, overnight children's camps, "prolonged or deliberate" contact while playing sports, buffet-style dining, and more.
